LITURGICAL REFLECTION: The Church has made clear statements on the practice of burying the remains of our dead. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in 2016 stated doctrinal and pastoral reasons for the preference of the burial of the remains of the faithful and to set out norms pertaining to the conservation of ashes in the case of cremation. 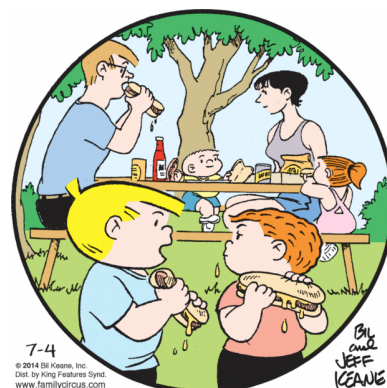
