FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

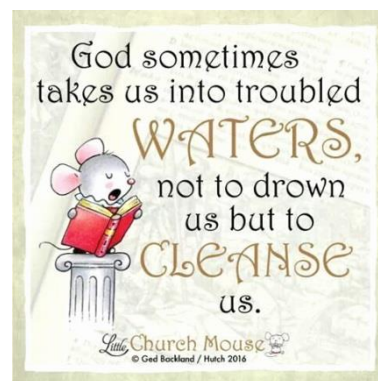
