JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Pope Leo XIV began his papacy with this message for the Pilgrims of Hope: *“Peace be with you all.”* These words, echoing Christ’s greeting after the Resurrection, set the tone for his vision of a Church rooted in unity, simplicity, and hope. He emphasized a return to the essentials – The Gospel, humility, and care for the poor and for gotten. In the words of the Pope: *“Christian hope flows from knowing that even if we fail, God will never fail us. Even if we betray him, he never stops loving us.”*

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION: In today’s Gospel as Jesus entered a village ten lepers begged Him for help:

“Jesus, Master! Have pity on us.” These words remind us that in all our difficulties and problems we can turn to Jesus and say, “Jesus, have pity on me.” Jesus is the One with whom we can share our deepest needs. Jesus cured the ten lepers but only one of them received salvation from Him. The other nine did not return to humbly prostrate themselves at the feet of Jesus after their healing, whereas the Samaritan man did. We must have faith, faith like the Samaritan leper, to see and believe and fall prostrate at the feet of Jesus to receive his salvation.
