JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

In his series of talks on the Jubilee theme “*Jesus Christ our Hope*,” Pope Leo reflected on the power of prayer. As the month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, he invites the faithful to pray it daily for peace in our world. He implores brothers and sisters in every state of life: families, the sick and elderly, and young people to confidently take up the Rosary and pray!

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION: Today’s Gospel parable contains an important teaching: Jesus says we “ought always to pray and not lose heart”.

Jesus is assuring us that unlike the dishonest judge, God promptly answers his children, even though this doesn’t mean he will necessarily do it when and how we would like. Prayer does not work like a magic wand! It helps us keep faith in God, and to entrust ourselves to him even when we do not understand his will.

2025 CMD: This year’s theme is “**Follow Me.**” This fund supports 10 Ministries throughout the diocese, which fall into 3 categories: evangelization, serving those in need, and formation of our priests and deacons.

This year’s goal for our parish is **\$10,600**. Everything over this goal is returned to us.

As of **September 30**, we have received **\$9,705.00** in cash and pledges plus **\$1,070.00** directly for our project, replacing the furnace.

2nd COLLECTION: This weekend, **Oct. 18-19**, we take up a collection for **World Mission Sunday** which calls Catholics worldwide to support the Church where it’s young or challenged.
